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Artificial intelligence (AI) has rapidly permeated every facet of modern life, seamlessly performing tasks ranging from trivial errands to complex decision-making processes. The allure of AI lies predominantly in its unmatched potential for efficiency, convenience, and accuracy. However, this unprecedented convenience brings with it a hidden yet profound threat: the subtle erosion of human capacity for critical thinking through cognitive offloading.

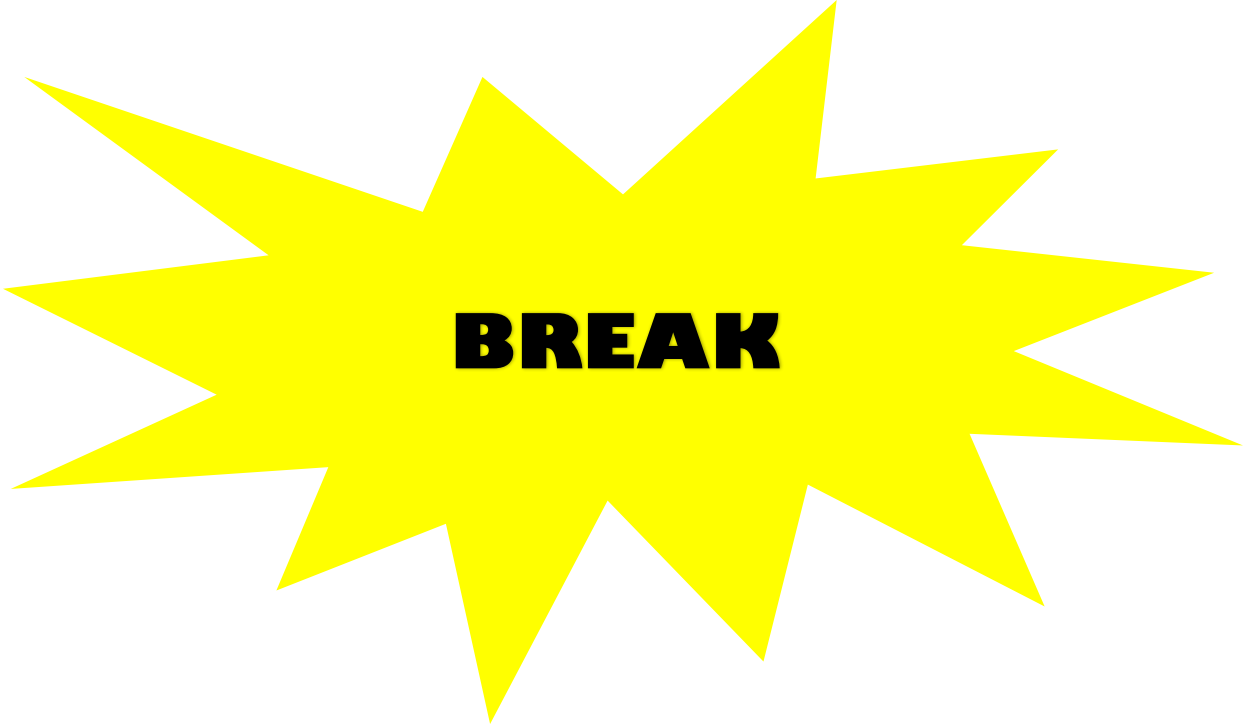

An author needs to exist (even only as
reference)

AI: One author, two authors, no author, everyone author?



Theoretically, great idea!?

But should we “save” the author?!

Not only about ego, but about ownership and rights

Technology is a collaborator, but does it get paid?

New techniques transform authorship constantly, but they also threaten craftsmanship

Inspiration and referencing is not the same as copyright infringement

Issues:

Artists are not involved in copyright debates

Companies dictate conditions and framing (documents)

Artists are not compensated

Artists' are increasingly unsure about the value / position in art production

AI SLOP

Creative, genius.... or just „banal“?

“The craziness of the content is balanced by “this incredibly banal, realistic style” that’s “very easy to process,” says Jonathan Gilmore, a professor of philosophy at the City University of New York, and co-editor of the Journal of Aesthetics and Art Criticism...

These pictures are “slop,” the tech world’s term for the image equivalent of spam.”

Let us go back in History: Issues with Reproducibility of Artworks (and Ownership)

According to Walter Benjamin ("The Artwork in Times of Technical Reproducibility", 1935)

"In principle a work of art has always been reproducible. Man-made artifacts could always be imitated by men....Mechanical reproduction of a work of art, however, represents something new. Historically, it advanced intermittently and in leaps at long intervals, but **with accelerated intensity.**" (Benjamin, 1935, 2)

"Even the most perfect reproduction of a work of art is lacking in one element: its presence in time and space, its unique existence at the place where it happens to be....This includes the changes which it may have suffered in physical condition over the years as well as the various changes in its ownership.

The traces of the first can be revealed only by chemical or physical analyzes which it is impossible to perform on a reproduction; changes of ownership are subject to a tradition which must be traced from the situation of the original. The presence of the original is the prerequisite to the concept of authenticity." (Benjamin, 1935, 3)

**AI IS NOT RE-PRODUCING
ART, BUT MATERIALLY RE-
DIGESTING IT.**

**ORIGINAL? TRADITION?
ORIGIN?**



Looking for similarities: “AI art” draws from aesthetics. It looks like art, so it’s art.

Aesthetic bias (about narrative, cultural memories, norms, popular refs, not about concept or performance)

Genius bias (male artist, never about collaboration between machines and wo/men)

NEW?

“To ask about the NEW is equal to asking about value. Why do we attempt to say something at all, to write, paint, or compose something that was previously not there? ...

In our desire to be ‘creative’ ourselves, are we perhaps just succumbing to a diabolical temptation that we should **in fact resist in order to maintain our integrity?**

To ask the question another way: What is the sense, what is the point of the new? These questions are premised on an unquestioned conviction: namely, that the desire for the new is the desire for truth.”

WHERE IS THE NEW IN AI ART?*

“TO DO THIS, IT ADOPTS A FUNNEL-LIKE STRUCTURE THAT TAKES READERS FROM WIDER CONTEXTUALISATION TO SPECIFIC ISSUES CONCERNING AI AND ART, TO THEN OPEN UP AGAIN, FROM THE OTHER END, TO SOME LARGER AND FUTURE-FACING QUESTIONS.

IT STARTS FROM THE POSITION THAT, TO UNDERSTAND THE PROMISE OF AI FOR THE CREATIVE FIELDS, WE MUST NOT REMAIN JUST IN THE REALM OF AESTHETICS.” (ZYLINSKA, 2020,16)

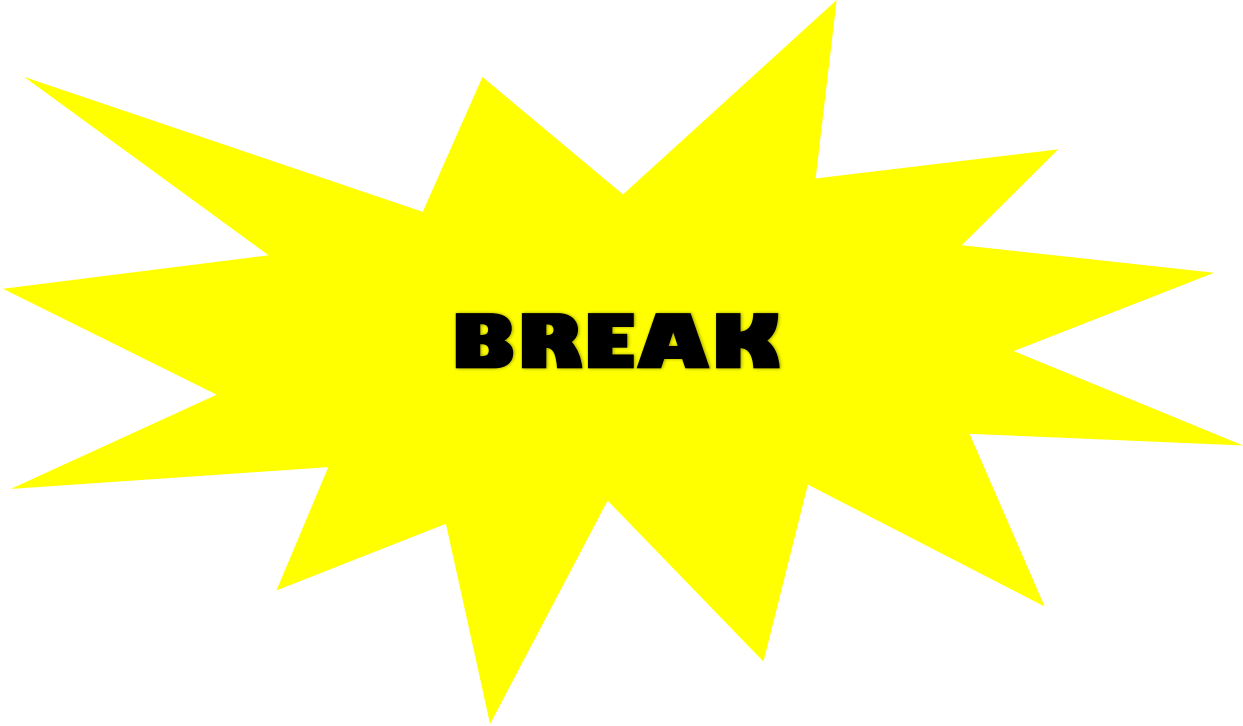

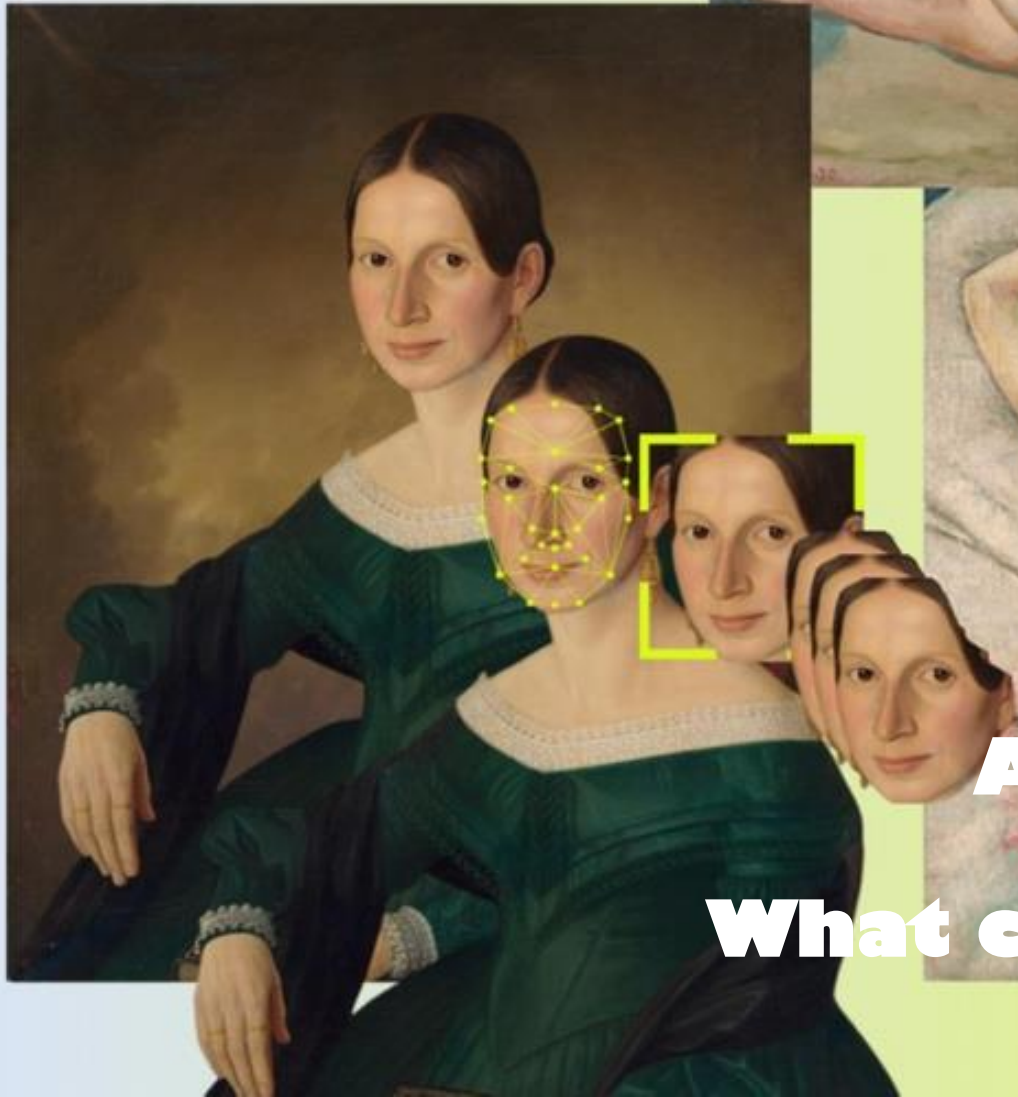

AI and the Art of Historical Reinterpretation

A key focus of this project is the elimination of gender-specific biases in historical datasets used by AI.

Raises questions about ethics and the possibilities of complementing, rewriting, and reinterpreting data archives using AI technology.

Garment/clothes has woven adversarial image and protects the biometric data of face (either will not be detectable or will be associated with an incorrect category)

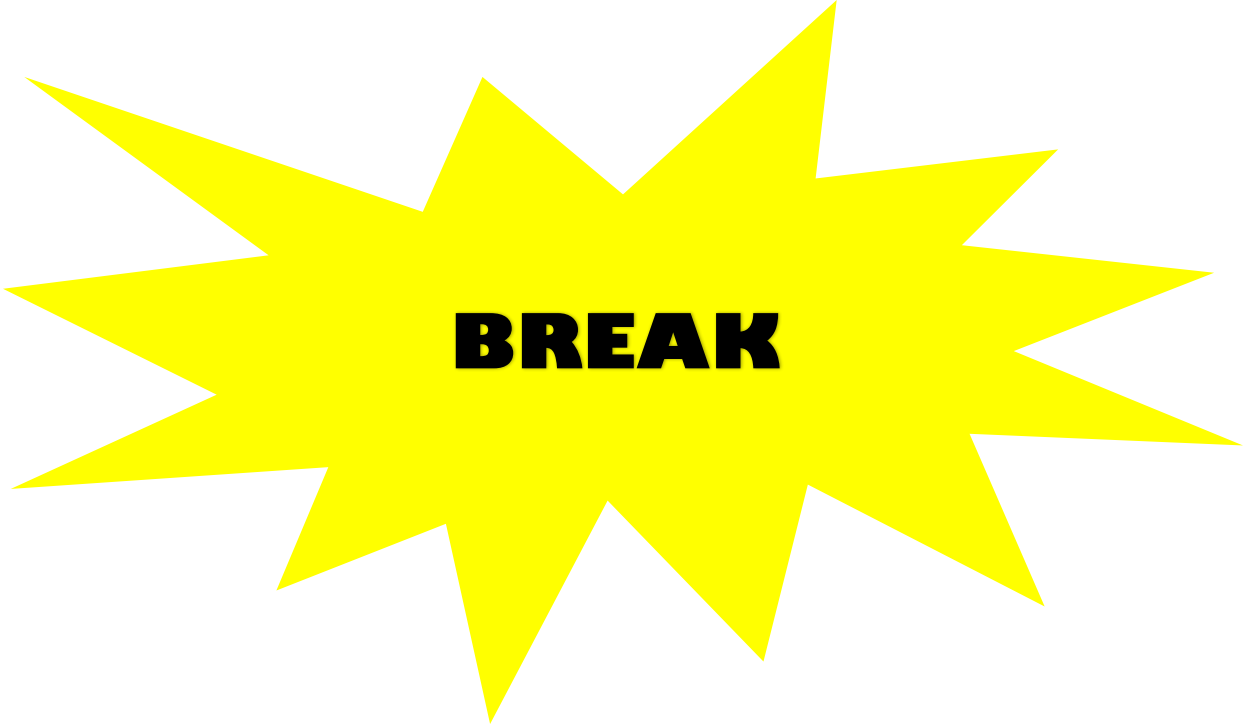
